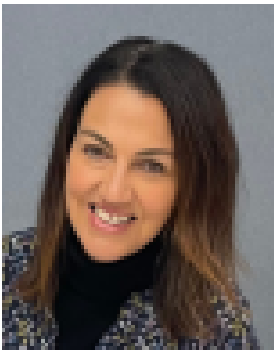

Staff appointments

Congratulations to Paula Kirkpatrick who has been appointed our Deputy Principal working with myself and Katherine Kimber our other Deputy Principal in the leadership space.

So what do Deputy Principals actually do at a Primary School? Here is the low down from Paula and Katherine.



Paula Kirkpatrick - Deputy Principal, Curriculum

I am privileged to have been appointed permanently to the Deputy Principal position this year. Here's a little insight into what my role entails. I am responsible for curriculum across the school. This means I help Dy set the strategic direction through our student achievement targets for the year. I then ensure our teaching and learning programmes are aligned to this and run professional development learning for the teachers as required. Another big part of my role is mentoring our team leaders so they can coach and mentor the teachers in their team.

Katherine Kimber - Deputy Principal, Inclusion and Diversity

Kia ora, I am the Deputy Principal responsible for Inclusion and Diversity at Paparoa Street. In this role, I oversee a dedicated and skilled team of 15 Learning Assistants and support teachers in developing effective strategies, and targeted interventions to meet the needs of individuals. I work closely and collaboratively with outside agencies such as Mana Ake and Resource Teachers of Learning and Behaviour (RTLb) and make referrals for individual support services through various agencies such as the Ministry of Education.

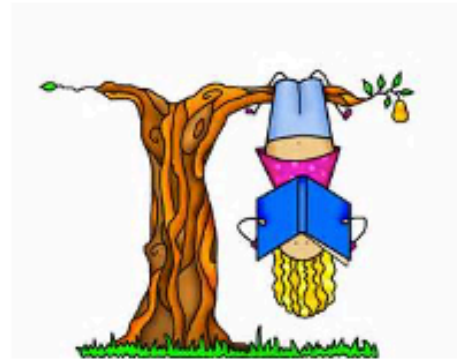
